Summary of learning in Term 3

Authors

Stories: The Journey Home, The Gruffalo, The Smeds and the Smoos

Phonics: 5Phase 5

Writing: We will be writing our fact files about animals based on the story 'The Journey Home'. We will also write character descriptions based on the story 'The Gruffalo'.

Throughout the year we will focus on language development and continue to follow the Early Years Goals for communication and language.

Learning for life

This term we will explore the unit: dreams and goals. We will learn how to set and achieve simple goals and how to identify and overcome obstacles that might come across when trying to achieve those goals.

Religious Education

Our RE topic this term is "Why is our world special?" The children will be learning why different people from different religions believe our world is special. We will also be looking at different stories about the creation of the world in this topic

Art

We will be be inspired by flora and fauna to create collages.

Design Technology

We will be making our own healthy snacks by slicing fruit and vegetables.

PE

In our outdoor sessions we will be consolidating ball skills and accuracy by learning target games outside. Inside we will be learning gymnastics skills.

Computing

The children will be doing a coding topic this term.

Children will learn what an algorithm is and will be exploring creating algorithms with Beebots/the Beebot app.

Maths

We will be exploring place value and addition and subtraction up to 20. We will also consolidate our quick recall of number facts.

Geography

We will be answering the question: What do I know about where I live?

We will be using maps and atlases to locate where we live. We will explore our local area and identify human and physical features. We will then make our own maps

Music

We will continue to attend singing assemblies, learning new songs. In music lessons, we will be learning a song called 'round and round' (bossa nova). We will be finding the pulse in the music and using percussion instruments to play along

Key knowledge

Locate the Equator, North Pole and South Pole on a map.

Use an atlas to name and locate the 7 continents and 5 oceans.


Know it is hot and <mark>dry</mark> at the equator and cold at the North and South poles.

Know the country I live in is England and the city I live in is Bristol.

Use North, South, East and West to describe places on a map.
