Summary of learning in Term 3

Authors

Poetry

This term, year 4 will learn about figurative language in more depth. Last term we focused on similes and personification and this term we will have a greater insight into metaphors.

Sticky Knowledge

Humans need food and water to survive and stay healthy. When humans eat, food travels through the digestive system.

The human digestive system is made up of the mouth, teeth, oesophagus, stomach, small and large intestine, and anus.

Humans have incisors, canines and molars. Each tooth has a different function.

Animals have basic needs to survive.
Animals need food from plants and other animals.

A food chain is used to show the order in which living things depend on each other for food.

A food chains identifies producers, predators and prey.

Prior Knowledge:

Vocabulary				
digestive system	The digestive system breaks down food into small particles, which are absorbed into the blood.			
saliva	Saliva is a watery liquid in the mouth that keeps it wet and helps prepare food for digestion.			
oesophagus	The oesophagus is the tube in the body that takes food from the mouth to the stomach.			
stomach	The stomach is hollow, muscular organ that stores food and passes it to the intestines.			
intestine	The intestine is a long tube that is split into the small and large intestine. Food travels through the small and large intestine from the stomach and out of the body while it is being digested.			
canines	Canines are slightly pointed teeth that sit on each side of incisor teeth at the front of the mouth.			
molars	Molars are teeth found at the back of the jaw with a rounded or flattened surface.			
incisors	Incisors are sharp, flat teeth found at the front of the mouth.			
food chain	A food chain shows how living things depend on			

each other for food.
