Summary of learning in Term 6

<u>Authors</u>

This term we will be writing a narrative based on a short story.

In the second part of the term we will be writing a recount of a local walk.

Music

On Friday's this term we will be learning a friendship song. This will include singing and using a glockenspiel.

Learning for life

This term we will be focussing on 'changing me'.

Design Technology

This term we will explore using templates to join materials. We will learn to use a simple sewing technique called the running stitch. Children will make a hand puppet using this stitch.

Art

On Friday's in art our topic is 'Expressive Painting' and provides opportunities to explore colour mixing and mark making to create an abstract still life.

PE

Mondays we will be doing athletics outside as well as practicing for sports day.

Thursday we will be doing yoga in the hall.

Computing

This term we are completing a basic skills unit. This will include skills such as logging in, typing and finding information online.

Maths

We will spend the start of the term revising prior learning in preparation for SATs and then we will move on to look at capacity and volume, length and height and also position and direction.

Enquiry

Geography: In Geography we will be looking at the question 'How would my life be different in Malawi?' We will be locating Africa on a map and discovering wat life is like in Malawi and how it compares to life here in Bristol.

Religious Education

This term the topic is 'Where do we belong?'. We will discuss different groups we belong to. We will learn about belonging in different religious groups across Christianity, Judaism and Islam.
