Reminders

Uniform: From Thursday 4th September it is the expectation that all children are in the correct school uniform. On PE days, children should wear their PE t-shirts with their school jumper. On Forest School days, children can wear a white or green t-shirt with their school jumper.

School Attendance

All parents and carers have a responsibility to get their children into school on time, by **8:40am years 1-6, and 8.35am for Reception children**. If your child arrives late, this will be marked on the register. Your child will be asked why they are late. This is to help the school support you get to school on time. Being late can impact negatively on your child's ability to read as reading and phonics are taught in the morning. Arrival after 9:10am will be considered an unauthorised absence and may be subject to a Penalty Notice. Penalty notices are a fine of £80 per child, per adult.

The first day back at school is an important time for every child – it sets the tone for the year ahead. It's when new friendships are formed, routines are established, and each pupil begins to feel a sense of belonging within their class. Starting the term with a positive mindset helps children settle in more quickly, feel more confident, and ultimately have a more successful and enjoyable year at school. **We look forward to seeing you on Thursday 4th September.**
